Day 1 - Monday 8 December - Belfast

1. Conflict Textiles @ 3 Belfast Libraries

- Walking visit and tour for our international guests to UU Belfast Library, McClay Library & Linen Hall Library where Conflict Textiles are on display. Curator Roberta Bacic will lead.

2. Threads as Voices of Memory: Visual methodology for narrating trauma between body, site of memory, and tactile nature of (in)tangible narratives

- 3pm - 4.30pm, Queen's University Belfast (Moot Court room, School of Law)
- In this lecture, Selma Catović Hughes explores how using visual methodology in meaning-making artistic practice can transform traumatic memory into narrative memory and facilitate a social platform for individual and collective healing, remembrance, and resilience. Selma draws on her personal traumatic war-time experience from Bosnia and Herzegovina in addition to ongoing work by activists around the world, including arpilleras, the traditional artwork of appliqué and embroidery narrating stories from the dictatorship in Chile; and tatreez, the traditional embroidery in Palestine used as a tool to fight systematic erasure and support resistance

3. My Father's Diaries: Screening & Panel Discussion

- 6pm - 8:15pm, Queen's Film Theatre, Screen 2
- Film screening of My Father's Diaries: It is August 1993 when Bekir Hasanović exchanges a gold coin for the camera he will use to film everyday life in Srebrenica from then on. The images he records during the days of the war with his improvised crew, called Dzon, Ben & Boys, give life to the unexpected portrait of a population lost, though able to maintain a solid connection with reality without giving up its typical humor. Ado, Bekir's son, starts from these images and from the pages of the diaries kept by his father to reconstruct the image of his father and, together with his mother Fatima, finally be able to understand how he survived the Death March and the Srebrenica genocide.

The Museum team have continued to work with Roberta over the years on countless exhibitions, programmes and workshops.
