SUBJ: NORTHERM IRELAND

DEAP SIF POPERT:

THANK YOU FOR THE MESSAGE ON MOPTHERS IFELAND.

WE, OF COURSE, HOPE VERY MUCH THAT THE CURRENT NEGOTIATIONS WILL LEAD TO AN ANGLO-IRISH ACREEMENT. HE RECOGNIZE, AS YOU INDICATE, THAT AM AGREEMENT WOULD NOT SOLVE ALL THE MANY COMPLEX PROBLEMS OF NOFTHERM IRELAND. BUT, IT CEPTAINLY WOULD BE A POSITIVE STEP, AND ONE THAT I SAN ASSURE YOU WOULD BE WELCOMED PUBLICLY BY US.

ALLOW ME TO ALSO ASSUPE YOU THAT WE ARE WILLING TO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITY OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT. WHILE THERE IS DEEP CONCERNHERE OVER THE PUDGET DEFICIT, CONGRESSIONAL ATTITUDES CONCERNING A NORTHERN IPELAND RECONSTRUCTION FUND ASS DEMERALLLY POSITIVE.

HE FULLY UNDERSTAND THE POSSIBLE DAMAGE TO PROGRESS THAT PREMATURE DISCLOSURE VOULD CAUSE. HE DO, HOVEVER, HOPE THAT AT THE APPROPRIATE STACE YOU FULLY BRISE STATE ON YOUR PLANS. SHOULD WE BE ABLE TO WORK OUT AN OFFER OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT, THERE WOULD SURELY BE CONCRESSIONAL HEARINGS AND STATE WOULD HAVE THE LEAD IN TESTIFYING BEFORE CONCRESS.

AS AN ASIDE, PERMIT ME TO NOTE THAT AN ANGLO-FRISH AGRESMENT ON NORTHERN TRELAND WOULD, IN MY VIEW, HELP EASE OPPOSITION TO OUR SUPPLEMENTARY EXTRACITION TREATY.
