He was commenting following a meeting with Mr Quinn's parents and went on to endorse the view expressed by International Monitoring Commission member John Grieve that former members of the terrorist organisation, or their associates, could have been responsible.

Mr Lenihan should acknowledge that If Paul Quinn was beaten to death by Provos it is irrelevant whether or not the murder was "authorised" by some sort of command structure.

Mr O Caolain should understand that if a bunch of Provos can still get together to commit murder, it makes a mockery of assurances made by the republican movement.
